

Year 10 GERMAN

Overall Intent:

In Year 10, GCSE students develop further their knowledge of German, building on the key language and grammar introduced in the first 2 or 3 years. The key topics are education, leisure time, food, health and fitness, family, relationships, house and home, media, technology and holidays. The content is carefully layered to facilitate progression in terms of sophistication and length of response. Language is taught in a very structured way initially, and where context permits, greater independence is encouraged. Early on in the Year 10 course students revise the present, past and future tenses and important aspects of German word order.
